Were you recently injured while riding in an Uber or Lyft in Indianapolis? Accidents involving ridesharing vehicles are more complex than regular car accidents, and seeking compensation for your injuries may not be straightforward. Although Uber and Lyft have been around for several years and have become popular transportation options, insurance companies still struggle to deal with liability issues following a rideshare accident in Indianapolis.

How are Uber and Lyft accidents different from regular car accidents?

When an Uber or Lyft driver gets into an accident, it presents more complicated liability issues than when two regular drivers get in a crash. Ridesharing is still a relatively new concept in the auto insurance world, so there are still many open questions about how to establish liability in case of an accident.

There are several factors that make ridesharing accidents more complex than regular ones:

- Rideshare drivers are independent contractors. If the accident occurs when the Uber or Lyft driver has no passengers, the ridesharing companies may be able to dispute liability for it.
- More parties may be involved. Regular car accidents usually involve the two drivers that collided. Ridesharing accidents could also include passengers, as well as the ridesharing companies themselves.
- Indiana is a "fault state." You file a claim against the other driver's insurance rather than your own after an accident. But in a ridesharing crash, it may be unclear which insurer to file with.

If you've been in an Uber or Lyft accident, consider contacting a personal injury attorney. They'll know best how to interpret the current laws about auto insurance and can help you deal with your insurer.

Who's at fault in a ridesharing accident?

In an Uber or Lyft accident, the person at fault is the one whose actions led to the accident. In most scenarios, the person at fault is either the rideshare driver or the other driver. Passengers typically aren't considered at fault in ridesharing crashes, nor are the ridesharing companies.

Determining who is at fault in a car accident is essential if one party wants to recuperate losses from the other party. However, in ridesharing accidents, proving a party was liable for the accident can be complicated.

Companies like Uber and Lyft usually require drivers to have the minimum liability auto insurance coverage allowed in Indiana, which is \$25,000 for uninsured motorists, \$25,000 for property damage, and \$50,000 for underinsured motorists. The companies also provide drivers liability coverage that changes depending on the driver's situation:

- The driver is not logged into the ridesharing app: No coverage is provided.
- The driver is logged into the app but has not yet accepted a ride request: Coverage is provided of up to \$50,000 per person and \$100,000 per accident, in addition to \$25,000 for property damage if the ridesharing driver is the at-fault party.
- The driver is logged into the app and has accepted a ride request: Coverage is provided of up to \$1 million if the ridesharing driver is the at-fault party.
